

Lung Cancer Screening

Current or former heavy smokers are advised to undergo CT scan screening to detect cancer early.

Current or former heavy smokers are advised to undergo CT scan screening to detect cancer early, when it's easier to treat—but only around 2% do so. To help boost screening, new guidelines from the U.S. Preventive Services Task Force recently expanded eligibility. Previously, screening was recommended for people age 55 and older who smoked at least a pack a day for 30 years (30 pack-years) and who either still smoke or quit within the past 15 years. The new recommendation lowers the screening age to 50 and the pack-year threshold to 20.

These changes are expected to nearly double the number of individuals who meet the screening criteria and will include more women and Black people.
